<b>Effects / learning outcomes (knowledge, skills and social competences)</b>	Learnings, through the examples, about how economic actors : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• maintain the link between farmers and consumers</li> <li>• preserve the proximity between the stakeholder in particular in the growing phase of their projects</li> <li>• highlight the link between the food products and their environmental, social and cultural embeddedness</li> <li>• share the bargaining power</li> <li>• survive in a competitive market and remain sustainable in the area</li> </ul>
